Application for an AFSCAN Studentship


- AFSCAN Studentships are designed to allow an undergraduate veterinary student in the 4th or 5th year of their programme to spend a 6 – 8 week period of time working in a research laboratory as part of extramural experience.
- The laboratory may be in their own institution or in another institution.
- Each veterinary school is permitted to make one application for their highest ranked student.
- The value of these awards is US\$1,000. Of this sum, \$500 is allocated to the student for a living stipend and the remaining \$500 may be used for bench fees or consumables for the research project.
- The project supervisor will be responsible (through their institution) for management and allocation of the budget.
- Research projects are expected to address issues related to disease or welfare of companion animals of relevance to African society.
- A final report on the project must be submitted to AFSCAN by the supervisor.


